Program overview


We have partnered with a great organization who is able to facilitate work opportunities throughout New Zealand. Placements are typically within Hospitality, Agriculture, Marketing, Finance etc and experience the culture of New Zealand at the same time and learn new skills.

Our partner organisation's philosophy is to provide the opportunity for young people to experience life in another country, while at the same time allowing them the freedom to develop inter-personal skills and independence. Whilst providing a safe haven for trainees, while giving them the space to learn and grow as traveling individuals.

The program will include step by step assistance throughout the whole process from completing the necessary paperwork, interview guidance, assistance with visa application as well as assistance with flights, travel insurance, as well as an opportunity to meet other adventurous travellers at orientation.

In order to qualify

- Have at least 6 months experience related to the placement you are looking for
- Be single and between ages of 20-30
- Be mature, flexible, open minded and willing to work long hours
- Be a South African, Zimbabwe, Swaziland, Lesotho passport holder
- Be in good health and not in possession of or using any drugs other than those recommended by a doctor
- Hold a clear criminal record

Before you sign up, ask yourself
these questions:

Are you mature, flexible, open-minded, committed and willing to make adjustments?

Are you able to develop a stable relationship with a host family and fellow workers,
and become part of a working team?

Can you be polite, conscientious, courteous and avoid cultural political and
economic value comparisons that might lead to conflict with hosts?

Can you work long hours at certain peak times in the season. Farming in
New Zealand can be labour intensive?

Are you willing to try new experiences, and participate in activities?

What's included in the program?

The program is not a package holiday. Paying and turning up does not guarantee success here. You have to engage fully, get completely involved in everything, be energetic, hard working, willing to learn and try new things, and become good at finding ways to be useful.

This will shape the way your experience develops.

Your success here is mostly down to you, and is determined by your attitude. You also need to be physically and mentally fit.

You don't have to be a superhero to succeed here. Thousands of young people have enjoyed and experienced good and great things in rural Australia, many probably just like you.

- ▶ Step by step assistance throughout the program from completing all required paperwork to obtain the necessary paperwork to legally work in New Zealand for up to a maximum of 12 months
- ▶ Confirmed placement and contract documentation
- ▶ Pre-departure orientation - Vital information to get you ready for the adventure of a lifetime
- ▶ Post arrival orientation with respective program partner which involves meeting other like minded travelers, complete necessary paperwork, getting assisted with a bank account, applying for a tax no.
- ▶ Assistance with all travel arrangements to get to host employer
- ▶ Back up support throughout full length of program

If you accepted on the program then its because one or more things in your application form told us that you would be capable of succeeding in this environment. Thousands of young people from all walks of life have succeeded here.

Please do not make the mistake of assuming that the great experiences that so many people speak of having had in New Zealand will come to you easily. You will have to work hard for them and you will have to deal with many new and potentially challenging circumstances along the way, especially at the beginning.

It won't all be easy, and there may well be some things that you may not like. Be prepared for it to be tough; that is all part of the adventure, and this is what will make it feel all the more worthwhile long after you have returned home.

Costs

Spending money

All applicants need to arrive with a minimum of NZ \$1000 in support funds to pay for things such as food accommodation, travel and other expenses until they receive their first pay check. All applicants are also required to travel with a credit card.

Wages and Accommodation

Applicants will receive at least the minimum adult wage of NZD \$14.75 (R162.25) per hour. Some hosts will pay slightly more. Government taxation will be deducted from wages, as will accommodation costs in some cases. Upon departure trainees can apply for a tax refund and may, in some cases, receive back a small percentage of the tax paid. Holidays can be taken in consultation with hosts. If no holidays are taken during the placement there will be some holiday pay at the end. Our in-country partner will assist with sourcing accommodation for the duration of your program.
